Monthly Food Collections/Giving Tree:

- January Tabor House (provides men living with HIV/AIDS with a safe place to live and assists with their medical and substance abuse issues)
- February "Hands on Hartford" for their Manna Community Pantry (provides people in need with food, nutrition education, and links to services to help break the cycle of poverty)
- March The Catholic Worker (provides housing for the homeless, food for the hungry and programs for children in need)
- April My Sisters' Place (focuses on finding housing for homeless women and children)
- May "Change for Global Change" (the parish, in conjunction with the Sisters of St. Joseph, assisted through prayer and donations to help establish sustainable water projects around the world)
- June Chelsea Place Care Center (provides inpatient skilled nursing and hospice care for medically complex patients with various forms of dementia)
- July Immaculate Conception Shelter & Housing Corporation (provides access to an emergency shelter as well as affordable housing for homeless people in the Hartford area)
- August Y-US (Youth United for Survival offers after school, weekend and summer programs to children who have been abused or abandoned)
- September Christ Church Cathedral ("Sunday Lunch Program" for the homeless and unemployed)
- October CT Humane Society (provides assistance to families struggling to feed their pets as well as provides care for homeless animals; to celebrate the feast day of St. Francis in a special way, the parish donated pet food and pet supplies)
- November Interval House (provides a 24 hour telephone line staffed by crisis counselors as well as a 20 bed shelter for battered women and children)
- December "The Giving Tree" which benefited Fernwood Manor (a residential care facility which assists independent individuals with psychiatric and/or geriatric conditions), Mercy Housing and Shelter (offers shelter and housing for homeless people), Peter's Retreat (a transitional living facility for people with HIV/AIDS), South Park Inn (provides emergency shelter for children and adults and offers crisis intervention and relocation to permanent housing), Tabor House (provides men living with HIV/AIDS with a safe place to live and assists with their medical and substance abuse issues), and individuals and families known to Father Jacobs and Sister Mary Louise)
